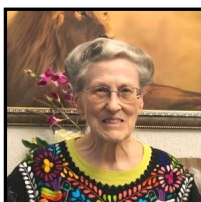
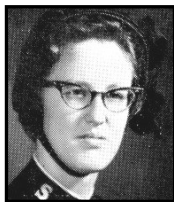

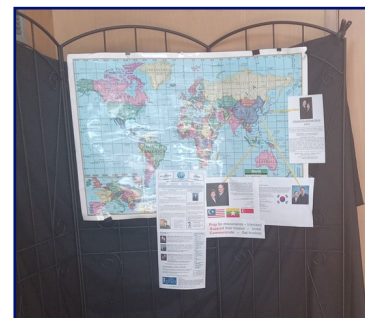
MISSIONARY TRIVIA
