### WHY SHOULD I PRAY FOR THOSE SERVING IN OTHER TERRITORIES?    WHY SHOULD I PRAY FOR THOSE SERVING IN FOREIGN LANDS?

They are the part of our "family" who are farthest away and we don't get to see often (maybe on Facebook) and we feel concern for them not knowing totally their situation. The Bible encourages us to pray for one another and that is a good reason to do so, but what motivates us to do so is feeling the need to do it. Having been "there" I can testify that prayer support keeps you going...

Prayers should be focused in 3 areas: Protection, Provision and Prosperity.

**Protection:** Even though we are unaware of what danger there might be, and that can be on both ends. I recall that once we received a communication from our home territory (USA South) wanting to know if we were okay? In those days communication wasn't as easy or instant as today. As you can imagine, what is being portrayed in the news may be far worse than reality. Over the years we were surprised how "dangerous" it was but unaware that anything could happen to us or our children. We knew there were folks praying for our safety. Whether in a major earthquake, political unrest, our home robbed, being lost in a remote area of Mexico etc. God brought us through. So praying for protection is important even though we are unaware of the circumstances.

**Praying for provision** is also important. Praying that those serving in less affluent circumstances will have what they need to do their ministry. God does provide and equip sometimes through interesting ways. We can readily testify that even though there were times when we were not able to receive a "salary" we never lacked anything. Just when needed there would be that knock at the door with a basket of food! Even living in Chile during a time when food was rationed and things were especially difficult for foreigners, the soldiers in our corps shared from their small supply! God always provided the means to get to where we needed to be, whether by bicycles, fare for the train and as much as a new Jeep! Once when I was very ill God even got me into a hospital that did not have any beds available! So whether we know the needs or not, asking God to meet them is another good thing to mention in our prayers.

**Praying for prosperity** or better still effectiveness in the ministry. Pray that the purpose for that person being there whether in a corps, service center or at headquarters be accomplished. It won't always be what they can do but what God can do in and through them. It is God's work and we get to participate whether here or there. Sometimes the greatest "work" is done in us! It is also true that God will get it done in His timing. I once thought that it would take at least 10 years to get things done and worked out in Paraguay. God did it in 1 year and better than I would have ever imagined!

Serving God is a great adventure and let us pray for those giving there service in faraway places. May God protect them, provide for their needs and prosper the ministry. May we all serve Him faithfully wherever He has us serving Him at the moment. In a sense, we are all missionaries!

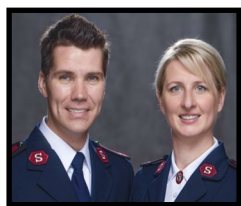
