## PROGRAMS & SERVICES



### CORPS COMMUNITY CENTER

Onsite Dental Care is offered to residents without insurance. Open as an Emergency Winter Shelter (including dinner) when evenings are below 32 degrees. Emergency assistance is offered for food, utilities, and rent. Operates Jefferson County's only feeding program. Provides clothing, Christmas gifts and toys for kids and back to school supplies. Weekly worship services, kids' programs and senior adult programs.

### HELPING HANDS DENTAL CLINIC

Opened in 2008, The Salvation Army has provided free dental care for Jefferson County residents in need for 14 years. Volunteer dentists currently provide nearly \$200,000 worth of dental care every year to people who would otherwise go without. As of 2022, we have provided well over \$1 million in free dental care.

### EMERGENCY DISASTER SERVICES

Mobilizes officers, employees, volunteers, and mobile food trucks to provide emergency services to victims and first responders on a local, regional, and national level. Provides spiritual and emotional counseling, emergency shelter, food, water, and financial assistance at crucial moments. Emergency winter shelter provided overnight at the corps when temperatures drop.

### ADDICTION SERVICES

Provides resources for people seeking residential addiction treatment services that include counseling, spiritual guidance, and life skills to avoid relapse. The Harbor Light Center (Indianapolis) is state certified with the Indiana Division of Mental Health and Addiction. Other drug and alcohol rehabilitation services include the Adult Rehabilitation Centers in Fort Wayne and Indianapolis.

### HIDDEN FALLS CAMP

A 700-acre camp near Bedford. It features nature trails, indoor pool, fishing, high ropes course, archery range and log cabins. Nearly 500 camp experiences are provided to kids and senior adults from across Indiana every summer. Individuals are able to participate in various camps (STEAM, music, art, discipleship, age-specific camps), focusing on the body, mind, and spirit.

### BREAKING THE CYCLE OF POVERTY

The Pathway of Hope program mentors families by teaching life skills and helping to set goals for housing, employment, budgeting, education, and transportation to break generational poverty. The goal is to move from crisis to sufficiency. This is the "teach a person to fish" component of our mission.

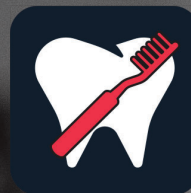

## STORY OF HOPE

In late August of 2025, Shelby, an elderly woman in her 60s, started coming to The Lord's Kitchen, The Salvation Army of Madison's feeding program. One day, while Shelby was enjoying her meal, the Madison case manager met her and started talking. They quickly connected over life and dogs. As Shelby got more comfortable, she started to be open about being homeless and living in her car with her dog. Shelby shared that she had been living in her car for over a month because she was unable to pay some bills, and she was running from an abusive relationship that had lasted 10 years. Shelby had a plan to get out of the situation, though. She was currently working at a restaurant and was saving up to afford a place for her and her dog. After meeting the case worker, Shelby learned that she could start using the washing machines and showers at The Salvation Army of Madison.

In October, Shelby had found a place to live, but the rent plus deposit was more than she had saved. She applied for financial assistance through the Salvation Army of Madison and received \$300 to help with her rent. She was then able to pay the deposit. Shelby still eats at The Lord's Kitchen from time to time, but is now living a more sustainable life in her own place with her dog.
