PROGRAMS & SERVICES



CORPS COMMUNITY CENTER

Emergency assistance (food, utilities, and clothing) for Kosciusko and Whitley County families facing economic challenges. Christmas Angel Tree supplies toys, clothing, and food. Tools for School provides back-to-school supplies. Weekly worship services, youth programming, adult Bible studies, and senior services. Operation Valor assists veterans with Bibles, spiritual counsel, material assistance, and personal care hygiene kits with custom prayers for veterans.

CHOICE FOOD PANTRY & WORK CLOTHING

Clients in need can choose food, produce, diapers, and hygiene items from the Choice Food Pantry. We also help people obtain or retain employment with assistance on work related items like work shoes.

MUSIC ARTS PROGRAM

A 10-week program offered to kids age 9-17 years old. A variety of classes are available including brass, guitar, and chorus. Students perform a concert at the end of the program for the community. The program focuses on developing skills, friendships, and a relationship with God

YOUTH OUTREACH

The Salvation Army provides school shoe vouchers for students each summer and throughout the school year when referred by teachers and staff. Monthly youth nights provide a fun environment for area young people in grades K-12. A primary goal is engaging with Pathway of Hope families for all youth outreach activities.

HIDDEN FALLS CAMP

Hidden Falls Camp is a 700-acre camp near Bedford. It features nature trails, an indoor pool, fishing, a high ropes course, an archery range, and log cabins. Nearly 500 camp experiences are provided to kids and senior adults from across Indiana every summer. Individuals are able to participate in various camps, focusing on the body, mind, and spirit.

BREAKING THE CYCLE OF POVERTY

The Pathway of Hope program mentors families by teaching life skills and helping set goals for housing, employment, budgeting, education, and transportation to break generational poverty. The goal is to move from crisis to sufficiency. This is the “teach a person to fish” component of our mission.
