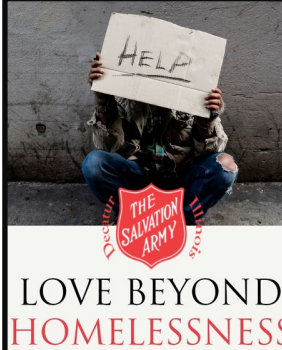

Pathway of Hope

- 21 Households (23 adults & 42 children)
 - 30 male
 - 35 female
 - 18 African American
 - 16 Caucasian
 - 31 other
- POH provides: communication, clothing, education, job ready, employment, childcare, counseling, home items, rent & utility assistance)

History of POH Since 2013

- Served 157 adults & 289 children

Homeless Prevention

- 48 Households Assisted in Rent or Utility Assistance
 - \$242,454.25 in Assistance

Men’s Shelter

- Served 329 Men (unduplicated)
 - 141 African American
 - 171 Caucasian
 - 17 other
- 149 Cold Cots (23 to regular beds)
- 73 Men into permanent housing
- 55 Men employed
- 26 Veterans assisted
- 818 Linkages

History of Men’s Shelter (since 2008)

- Served 1,966 men
- 631 declared “successful”
- 930 moved into permanent housing

Food Pantry

- 1103 individuals (monthly average Jul. through Dec. 2024)
- 830 adults (monthly average)
- 273 children (monthly average)

- 2023 monthly average: 773 individuals

New hours in 2024:

Tues & Thurs 4p-6p / Sat 8a-10a

Seniors Programs

- Seniors: monthly lunch, 1st Friday/Month

Youth Programs (September through December)

- 56 enrolled (40 average per week)
- 10 Adult Leaders
- Programs include music, character building, cultivating relationships, Sunday ministry, meals provided, and more.

Corps / Church Programs

- Home League (Women’s Ministries): lunch, program, and fellowship every Thursday.
