PROGRAMS & SERVICES



CORPS COMMUNITY CENTER

Provides emergency assistance to Anderson County families facing economic challenges. Weekly character building programs for children (K-12) along with men's and women's fellowships. Worship services held on Sundays. Prayer meetings on Wednesdays. Spiritual care provided daily.

PROJECT H.O.P.E.

Hosted by the Madison County Sheriff's Department Chaplaincy program, Project H.O.P.E. is a 13 week leadership mentoring program for youth between the ages of 13-17 years old. Strives to provide love and support for youth struggling to find their purpose in life.

ADDICTION SERVICES

Provides resources, referrals, and transportation for people seeking residential addiction treatment services that include counseling, spiritual guidance, and life skills to avoid relapse. The Harbor Light Center is state certified with the Indiana Division of Mental Health and Addiction. Other treatment programs include the Adult Rehabilitation Centers in Fort Wayne and Indianapolis.

EMERGENCY DISASTER SERVICES

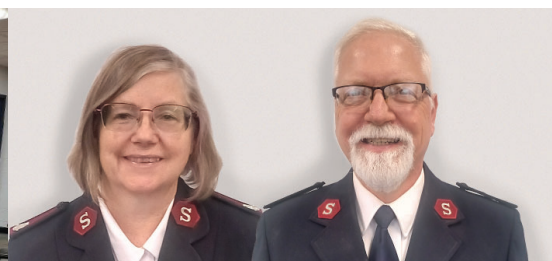
Mobilizes officers, employees, volunteers and mobile food trucks to provide emergency services to victims and first responders. Provides spiritual and emotional counseling, emergency shelter, food, water, and financial assistance at crucial moments.

HIDDEN FALLS CAMP

Hidden Falls Camp is a 700-acre camp near Bedford. It features nature trails, indoor pool, fishing, high ropes course, archery range and log cabins. Over 600 kids and senior adults from across Indiana participate every summer in various camps (STEAM, music, art, discipleship, age-specific camps), focusing on the body, mind, and spirit.

CHARACTER BUILDING PROGRAMS

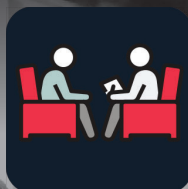

STORY OF HOPE

Once a month the Anderson Corps hosts a lunch for veterans featuring resources for them and people to talk to. It is a place for veterans to connect with each other and find help.

One month a veteran named Wendy walked into the corps in search of assistance. She had recently lost her job and was beginning to feel that impact financially. Wendy was a single mother of an adult daughter who also had one child. Her daughter had fallen into hard times as well and Wendy had been helping out by paying her daughter and grandchild's rent on top of her own.

Since losing her job, Wendy could not even pay for her own rent, much less her daughters, meaning that she was in desperate need of help. Thankfully, Wendy found her way to the Anderson Corps and found the help she needed. During her visit, Wendy got a hot meal, financial help, and was connected with other agencies where she was able to apply for grants to help supplement her income. She was soon again able to provide herself, her daughter, and her grandchild with rent to maintain their safe housing. Wendy is forever grateful for the hope provided that day by The Salvation Army.
