

CORPS COMMUNITY CENTER

Provides emergency assistance for Bartholomew County families facing economic challenges. Christmas Angel Tree provides toys, clothing, and food for children. Partnerships provide school supplies. Sponsors at-risk youth to Hidden Falls Camp. VBS and adult and senior programs. Monthly family night at a local restaurant for crafts and Bible study.

SALVATION ARMY FEEDING PROGRAM

Serves prepared meals to more than 50 people every week. Some people have nowhere else to turn for a meal. Sponsors and volunteers help support this important ministry.

ADDICTION SERVICES

Provides resources, referrals, and transportation for people seeking residential addiction treatment services that include counseling, spiritual guidance, and life skills to avoid relapse. The Harbor Light Center is state certified with the Indiana Division of Mental Health and Addiction. Other treatment programs include the Adult Rehabilitation Centers in Fort Wayne and Indianapolis.

EMERGENCY DISASTER SERVICES

Mobilizes officers, employees, volunteers and mobile food trucks to provide emergency services to victims and first responders on a local, regional, and national level. Provides spiritual and emotional counseling, emergency shelter, food, water, and financial assistance at crucial moments.

HIDDEN FALLS CAMP

Hidden Falls Camp is a 700-acre camp near Bedford. It features nature trails, indoor pool, fishing, high ropes course, archery range and log cabins. Over 400 kids and senior adults from across Indiana participate every summer in various camps (STEAM, music, art, discipleship, age-specific camps), focusing on the body, mind, and spirit.

BREAKING THE CYCLE OF POVERTY

The Pathway of Hope program mentors families teaching life skills and helping to set goals for housing, employment, budgeting, education, and transportation to break generational poverty. The goal is to move from crisis to sufficiency. This is the "teach a person to fish" component of our mission.

Nancy got him resources through their food pantry and community partners. When Mark was ready, Nancy got him into The Salvation Army's Adult Rehabilitation Center in Indianapolis. He graduated from the program with flying colors.

Recently, Mark came to visit Nancy after a flood, just to check in. He did not ask for any help but Nancy wanted to see how the storm had impacted him. After talking for awhile, Nancy knew Mark needed a new solar panel or generator, as he was living in a camper and that was his way of obtaining power. The recent flood had also greatly damaged the wood in his flooring. Nancy quickly set to work to find funds and partners to help repair the damage from the storm so he did not end up homeless again. The Salvation Army of Columbus was able to help Mark in so many ways for many years, Nancy said, "I was just there to love him."
