PROGRAMS & SERVICES



CORPS COMMUNITY CENTER

Emergency assistance (food, utilities, rent, bus passes, etc.), Christmas Angel Tree (toys, clothing, and food), and Tools for School (back to school supplies). At-risk youth can be sponsored to attend 5-day summer camp at Hidden Falls Camp and VBS at the corps. Weekly worship services, youth after school programming, Bible studies and senior services.

CHRISTMAS ASSISTANCE

Serves as Allen County's largest assistance provider during the holiday season. Provide Christmas gifts, holiday meals, financial assistance, and emotional and spiritual care to nearly 4,000 local residents.

CHARLOTTE MINISTRIES

NICU assistance program, inspired by a staff member's struggle with having a baby in the neonatal intensive care unit. Case-by case basis. Care packages and financial assistance for families with a child currently in a NICU. Assistance provided upon demonstration of need and based on donations received.

ADDICTION SERVICES

The Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Center in Fort Wayne provides resources, referrals, and transportation for people seeking residential addiction treatment services that include counseling, spiritual guidance, and life skills to avoid relapse.

HIDDEN FALLS CAMP

700-acre camp near Bedford. Nature trails, indoor pool, fishing, challenge course, archery range and high-quality log cabins. Over 400 kids and senior adults from across Indiana participate every summer in various camps (STEM, music, art, age specific camps), focusing on renewing the body, mind and spirit.

BREAKING THE CYCLE OF POVERTY

The Pathway of Hope program mentors families teaching life skills and helping to set goals for housing, employment, budgeting, education, and transportation to break generational poverty. The goal is to move from crisis to sufficiency. This is the "teach a person to fish" component of our mission.

STORY OF HOPE

After donating to our Angel Tree program for several years, a single mother came into our corps needing to be served by that same program.
