

GOSHEN CORPS COMMUNITY CENTER

Provides emergency assistance for Elkhart County families facing economic challenges. Christmas Adopt-A-Family provides toys, clothing, and food for children. Partnerships provide school supplies. Hosts annual events including Pancake Day, a local-favorite. Weekly worship services, youth, adult and senior programs.

SENIOR PROGRAM

Provides monthly grocery order of various produce, canned items, and dry goods. Serves hot meals three times a week. Hosts weekly activities including bingo, worksheets, exercise activities, Bible study, crafts, weekly themes, embroidery club, adult VBS, opportunities to go shopping, and many other ways to enrich senior living.

EMERGENCY DISASTER SERVICES

Mobilizes officers, employees, volunteers and mobile food trucks to provide emergency services to victims and first responders on a local, regional and national level. Provides spiritual and emotional counseling, emergency shelter, food, water and financial assistance at crucial moments.

ADDICTION SERVICES

Provides resources for people seeking residential addiction treatment services that include counseling, spiritual guidance, and life skills to avoid relapse. The Harbor Light Center (Indianapolis) is state certified with the Indiana Division of Mental Health and Addiction. Other treatment programs include the Adult Rehabilitation Centers in Fort Wayne and Indianapolis.

HIDDEN FALLS CAMP

Hidden Falls Camp is a 700-acre camp near Bedford. It features nature trails, an indoor pool, fishing, high ropes courses, an archery range, and log cabins. Over 400 kids from across Indiana participate every summer in various camps, focusing on the body, mind, and spirit.

BREAKING THE CYCLE OF POVERTY

The Pathway of Hope program mentors families teaching life skills and helping to set goals for housing, employment, budgeting, education, and transportation to break generational poverty. The goal is to move from crisis to sufficiency. This is the "teach a person to fish" component of our mission.

STORY OF HOPE

Suzanne has been a client at The Salvation Army of
Goshen for many years. At 63 years of age, she is divorced
and living on disability with her grandson in a local mobile home
community. Her grandson's parents struggled with addiction issues
and have been in and out of treatment programs and incarcerated for
many years. These troubles lead to Suzanne raising and adopting her, now
10-year-old, grandson. When Suzanne was still able to work, she was making a
good income, however; due to her age, she was no longer able to make an income
outside of disability.

The Salvation Army of Goshen has been able to help Suzanne out using every resource and program that they offer. She has received help with prescriptions, diapers, formula, utility help, rent help, and paperwork assistance. The social worker at the Goshen Corps stated that "it has been a pleasure to help her along the way, as she is always grateful and appreciative of the assistance we have been able to offer throughout her years of need".
