

#### **CORPS COMMUNITY CENTER**

Provides emergency assistance (food, utilities, rent, prescriptions, clothing) for Floyd County families facing economic challenges. Christmas Angel Tree program provides toys, clothing, shoes, and food for over 3,000 children. Youth programs include Back to School assistance, day camps, and Kids Club (character building and Sunday Christian discipleship). Weekly worship services and senior services (Loving & Caring group).

### HARRISON CO. SALVATION ARMY CENTER

Provides emergency assistance (food pantry, utilities, rent, prescription assistance and clothing) for Harrison County residents in need. The Family Store is located at 1345 Corydon Ramsey Road (Corydon). Social Services assistance is handled online through SAHelp.org.

#### CLARK CO. SALVATION ARMY CENTER

Provides emergency assistance (food pantry, utilities, rent, prescription assistance, clothing), for Clark County residents in need. Center at 528 Little League Blvd (Clarksville) has a staff caseworker and a Family Store. Annual community Thanksgiving meal serves over 550 people in Floyd, Clark and Harrison Counties partnering with other agencies.

#### CRAWFORD, SCOTT, & WASHINGTON CO.

Provides emergency assistance (food pantry, utilities, rent) through partnerships with local partners who administer social service programming with The Salvation Army.

#### **EMERGENCY DISASTER SERVICES**

Mobilizes officers, employees, volunteers, and mobile food trucks to provide emergency services to victims and first responders on a local, regional, and national level. Provides spiritual and emotional counseling, emergency shelter, food, water, and financial assistance at crucial moments.

#### HIDDEN FALLS CAMP

A 700-acre camp near Bedford. Nature trails, indoor pool, fishing, high ropes course, archery range and log cabins. Over 400 kids & senior adults participate every summer in various camps (STEAM, music, art, discipleship, agespecific camps), focusing on the body, mind, and spirit.

#### Breaking the Cycle of Poverty

The Pathway of Hope program mentors families teaching life skills and helping to set goals for housing, employment, budgeting, education, and transportation to break generational poverty. The goal is to move from crisis to sufficiency. This is the "teach a person to fish" component of our mission.

# STORY OF HOPE

Growing up, Alexis experienced learning disabilities that kept her from graduating high school. Without a diploma, she faced a long struggle with unemployment and homelessness. As a single mother of three, she found it hard to provide for and care for her family. She reached out to The Salvation Army of Southern Indiana for help. Alexis began working with a case manager through The Salvation Army's Pathway of Hope Program. Through this program, Alexis was able to begin to break the generational bonds of poverty. With support from United Way, and other providers in the area, Alexis was able to earn her high school diploma, have a safe place to live, and care for her children. Today, Alexis is pursuing a career in nursing after earning her nursing assistant certification (CNA). Because of hard work, excellent case work through Pathway of Hope, and other community partners, Alexis has moved her three children into a stable home, learned communication and cooking skills, and is well on her way to self-sufficiency.
