

CORPS COMMUNITY CENTER

Provides emergency assistance for Shelby County residents facing economic challenges. Serves as a host site for daily feeding program and distributes clothing and hygiene products to those in need. Spiritual care is provided daily and weekly worship services are held on Sundays.

FEEDING PROGRAM

Offering lunch seven days a week. Weekdays are hosted and sponsored by The Salvation Army and weekends are hosted by The Salvation Army and sponsored by a wide array of local partners. Monday – Saturday lunch is served from 11:30-12:30 and Sunday from 12:00-1:00. Food pantry is offered to families in need once every 14 days on Mondays and Fridays 1-3:30.

BREAKING THE CYCLE OF POVERTY

The Pathway of Hope program mentors families teaching life skills and helping to set goals for housing, employment, budgeting, education, and transportation to break generational poverty. The goal is to move from crisis to sufficiency. This is the "teach a person to fish" component of our mission.

EMERGENCY DISASTER SERVICES

Mobilizes officers, employees, volunteers and mobile food trucks to provide emergency services to victims and first responders. Provides spiritual and emotional counseling, emergency shelter, food, water, and financial assistance at crucial moments.

ADDICTION SERVICES

Provides resources for people seeking residential addiction treatment services that include counseling, spiritual guidance, and life skills to avoid relapse. The Harbor Light Center (Indianapolis) is state certified with the Indiana Division of Mental Health and Addiction. Other treatment programs include the Adult Rehabilitation Centers in Fort Wayne and Indianapolis.

HIDDEN FALLS CAMP

Hidden Falls Camp is a 700-acre camp near Bedford. It features nature trails, indoor pool, fishing, high ropes course, archery, range, and log cabins. Over 400 kids and senior adults from across Indiana participate every summer in various camps (STEAM, music, art, discipleship, age-specific camps), focusing on the body, mind, and spirit.

STORY OF HOPE

The Salvation Army of Shelbyville's homeless services are changing lives every day by simply providing a place of acceptance. A 55-year-old man named Charles has been receiving assistance from the Shelbyville corps for quite some time and has not only seen a difference in his life but the lives of others in his community. Charles is a homeless alcoholic who says that "The Salvation Army has been a big part of my recovery, it breaks barriers, and changes people". When Charles came into the corps, he felt alone, broken and unable to communicate with others. Through the homeless ministry, Charles has had opportunities to connect with resources and others in his community, bringing more hope to his life. Charles explained that being a part of this ministry has provided him with a purpose and a place to be surrounded by people who love him. The Salvation Army meets people where they are without judgment. "The Salvation Army takes our homelessness, our pasts, our addictions, our shame and guilt and brings us together" said Charles, "it is a beacon of hope".
